Following the success of breed club health seminars in 2011 and 2012,

The AHT will once again be hosting informative health seminars at its Lanwades Park site in Suffolk for dog breeders interested in various health conditions affecting dogs.

Speakers include the AHT's Dr Cathryn Mellersh, Head of Canine Genetics, Dr Mike Starkey, Head of Cancer Research and Dr Tom Lewis, who has helped to pioneer the Mate Select online breeding tool.
